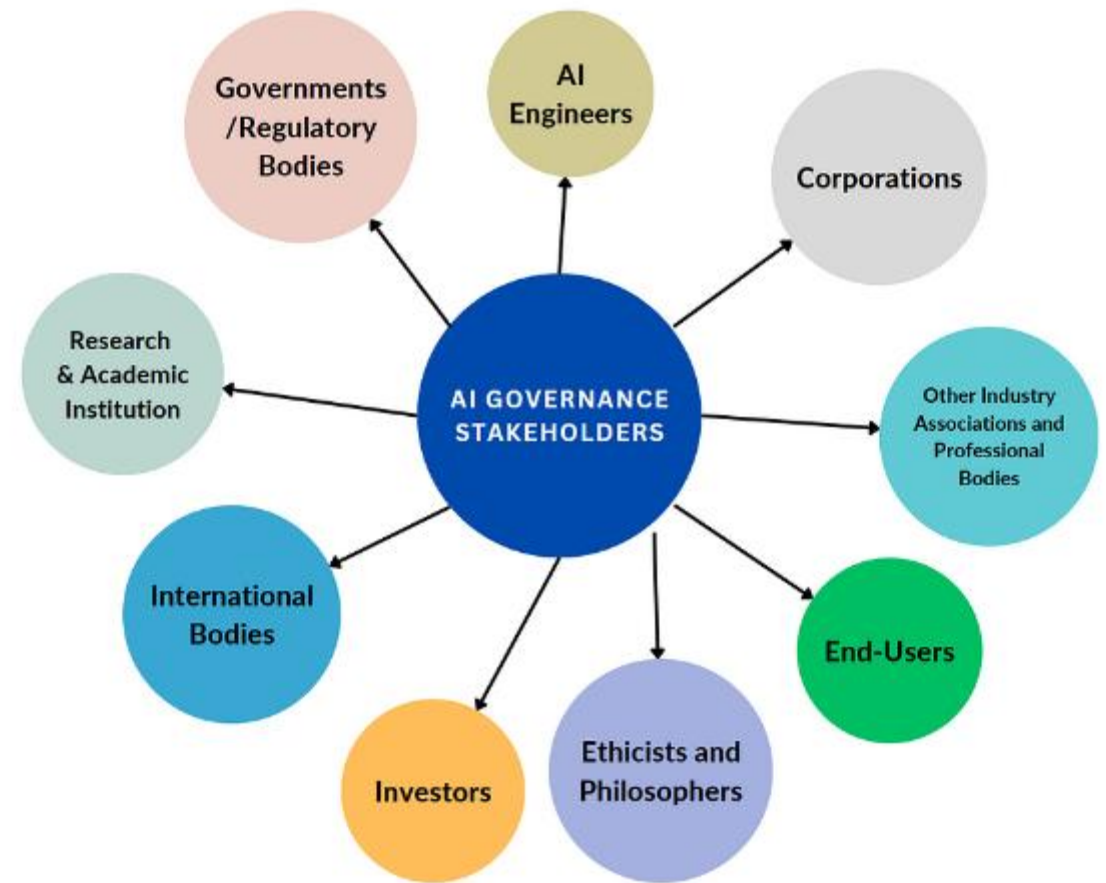

Stakeholder roles in artificial intelligence projects

The study provides descriptive information on artificial intelligence projects, including the life cycle, project characteristics, project roles, and stakeholders.

- ❖ It highlights how artificial intelligence projects differ from other projects based on the harms, damages, and losses they can impose on individuals, society, and the environment.
- ❖ It underscores why project owners, project managers, project teams, and operational organisations are moral agents responsible for the systems they develop.
- ❖ It identifies passive and representative stakeholder roles that should be considered by project managers and sponsors in the early stages of planning to account for, include, and engage stakeholders.
- ❖ It demonstrates an innovative use of applying the stakeholder salience model's harm and urgency attributes to identify and classify project stakeholders.

As teams within larger organisations become more empowered to make decisions and drive innovation, documentation and generating buy-in take on increasingly important roles. This is where a stakeholder analysis comes into play. Stakeholder maps outline the context for what the project stakeholders are, their level of influence, which key players are responsible for decision-making, and they provide a visual representation of how these all connect into a larger engagement strategy.
